Plans to expand to Year 9

EASTSIDE Christian School is a budding primary/middle school which is just starting to bloom.

Eastside is an independent Christian school which is a member of Lutheran Education, Australia.

The school, situated off Bounty St, Lindisfarne (the site of the old Eastside drive-in theatre), has been open for 21 years. However, the move into middle school (grades 6-8) only began last year.

There are currently 81 students in years prep to Grade 8.

This year Eastside welcomed a new principal, Mr Rob Sellars from Concordia College in Adelaide. He has a background in ministry as a pastor, which enhances the school's focus on Christian education.

The school is busily developing its facilities in preparation for the move into year 9 next year, including two new classrooms as well as new science, technology and computer labs.

Building grants have been received from the Association of Independent Schools and the Lutheran Church of Australia.

The curriculum is being redesigned to incorporate the Essential Learnings Framework, which will be a great way to deliver value-based education in a friendly, small and caring atmosphere.

This year's middle school students have been very positive about the move into middle school. The grade 6 students work together with the grade 7's, which makes an easier transition into secondary schooling.

"It is good because we get all these new subjects like IT and drama," Shannon Kleywegt, a grade 6 student, said.

Japan, India top teams of school mini-Olympics

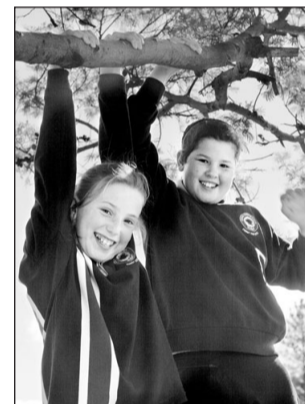
THE Eastside Christian School Mini-Olympics for grades prep to 3 was held on August 27.
