Klik and Play makes learning a game

CAMPBELL St Primary has been involved this year in a program run by New Town High School and funded by the Boys in Education Lighthouse Project.

As part of this program, Grade 5/6 classes have been learning how to make computer games using software called Klik and Play.

The students were first shown by New Town High School ICT specialist teacher, Mrs Meijers, what sort of games they could make.

She showed the Campbell Street students games that had previously been made by students at New Town High. The 5/6 classes then went to New Town to use the computer lab there.

They learned how to make a basic game and took a tour around the school in small groups with a New Town guide. This was great for the Campbell Street boys who will be going to New Town for high school.

Mrs Meijers then came to Campbell Street and taught four people how to make a series of different games. In all, they learned an alien game, platform game, space shooter and maze games.

The four initial "tutor" students then taught others in the class, who took turns to teach more people until the whole class had been taught and learned the game. This 'peer tutoring' worked well because everyone learned from each other

and the class members always had lots of "experts" to help them out.

Students in Grade 5/6 are now planning to enter computer games in the Screen It competition, which is run by the Australian Centre for the Moving Image to celebrate the 2006 Commonwealth Games.

The competition is for primary schools students and the winning games will be shown at the Australian Centre for the Moving Image in Melbourne.

IN BRIEF

Built on graveyard

CAMPBELL Street School is built on the site of a graveyard, belonging to Trinity Church. Most of the 5113 burials recorded from 1833 to 1872 were convicts, with many being sent for burial from the Hobart Gaol in Campbell Street. Convicts were usually buried in mass unmarked graves.

In 1923, the human remains were removed from the cemetery and taken to Cornelian Bay Cemetery. The present school was built on the site three years later.

CSPS Idol
